Background Introduction

Why have we produced this settlement profile for Mount Hawke?

Increasingly, we need good data to target programmes to the right areas, support funding applications, and help local communities with the evidence-base to support the development of community and parish plans.

However, although there is a great deal of data available for the smaller settlements (villages, hamlets, smaller towns and so on) across the South West, this information is rarely brought together in a single document for each of the settlements. Profiles of areas tend to be produced for Local Authorities or larger urban areas.

The South West ACRE Network (SWAN) of rural community councils commissioned Oxford Consultants for Social Inclusion (OCSI) to develop a set of profile reports for each of the smaller rural settlements across the South West.

What does this report contain?

This profile report provides detailed datasets developed and collected by OCSI for Mount Hawke, which lies in Carrick district, and has a population of 1535.

Alongside data on Mount Hawke, we also provide data for the County and Region. The sections in this report cover:

The South West Rural Deprivation study

- Access to services in the South West
- Who's there? Daytime populations in rural areas

What indicators have we used?

What is a "settlement"?

We have used the Office for National Statistics Output Area definitions of settlements to develop these profiles. Our data for Mount Hawke is based on these Output Area level definitions, so may include very small areas that lie outside the 'real' settlement boundary.

Key indicators in Mount Hawke

Population

- Mount Hawke lies in Carrick district (Cornwall and Isles of Scilly), and has a population of 1,535
- Of the total population, 262 (17.1%) are children, making up a smaller proportion of the population than across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly (17.3%). 459 (29.9%) are people of pensionable age, making up a larger proportion of the population than across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly (24.3%)
- Groups particularly vulnerable to exclusion include the 39 lone parent households, and 190 pensioners living alone.

Economy and employment

- Of those people of working-age in Mount Hawke, 629 are economically active
- The number of people receiving 'out-of-work' benefits (JSA and IB) in Mount Hawke is 62 (7.6% of all working-age people)
- In addition, 39 children are living in households where no members of the household are in work (13.9% of all children in Mount Hawke)

Deprivation and low income

- 84 people in Mount Hawke are receiving some form of DWP benefit, 10.3% of the working age population
- Based on the Index of Multiple Deprivation, 203 people across Mount Hawke are income deprived (13.6% of all people)

- Children and older people are typically more vulnerable to low income. Across Mount Hawke, 12.7% of all children live in income deprived households (34 children). 19.4% of older people in rural areas receive the Pension Credit Guarantee Element (corresponding to 90 older people)

Health

- 147 people in Mount Hawke report themselves as having a limiting long-term illness, 13.9% of the population (compared with 13.5% of people across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly)
- DWP health benefit data shows that 80 older people in Mount Hawke receive Attendance Allowance (17.4% of all older people)
- Across Mount Hawke, 67 people receive Disability Living Allowance (4.4% of all people)

Access to services

- 166 households have no car or van, 23.3% of all households in Mount Hawke
- Access to education, training and employment: No households are more than 8km from job centres, no households are more than 8km from secondary schools.
- Access to healthcare: No households are more than 8km from a principal GP site

Population Who lives in Mount Hawke?

The tables below show the total population with numbers of men and women and key age groups, the ethnic profile of the area, and household type:

- Mount Hawke lies in Carrick district (Cornwall and Isles of Scilly), and has a population of 1,535
- Of the total population, 262 (17.1%) are children, making up a smaller proportion of the population than across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly (17.3%). 459 (29.9%) are people of pensionable age, making up a larger proportion of the population than across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly (24.3%)
- The ethnic profile shows that, in Mount Hawke, the large majority is White British (98.2%)
- Groups particularly vulnerable to exclusion include the 39 lone parent households, and 190 pensioners living alone.

Worklessness

Being out of work can have a severe impact on an individual's quality of life – both in terms of the economic implications and in terms of the wider social exclusion implications. The impacts will be felt not only by the individual, but also by partners and dependent children.

The most recent indicators of 'worklessness' (people out of work who are unemployed, or who are unable to work due to sickness) are from Jobseekers Allowance (JSA) and Incapacity Benefit (IB) data:

- In Mount Hawke, 6 people were receiving JSA (0.7% of all working-age people), and 56 receiving IB (6.9% of all working-age people)
- The number of people receiving 'out-of-work' benefits (JSA and IB) in Mount Hawke is 62 (7.6% of all working-age people)
- In addition, 39 children are living in households where no members of the household are in work (13.9% of all children in Mount Hawke)

Deprivation and low income Social exclusion in Mount Hawke

Household incomes in rural areas are on average higher than in urban areas. Nevertheless, research over the last 25 years has consistently identified in the region of 20-25% rural households living in poverty, with higher levels in sparse and coastal areas¹.

Index of Multiple Deprivation

Based on the Index of Multiple Deprivation, rural areas across England are not highly deprived. Of the 6,496 most deprived areas across England, only 143 (2%) are rural.

- Analysis based on the IMD 2004 modelled down to Output Area (OA) level² indicates across Mount Hawke, there are no areas in the most deprived 20% of all areas in the region.

Working age claimants

Although no single indicator encapsulates the different dimensions of deprivation and exclusion for people in rural areas, the Working Age Client Group benefits dataset from DWP provides a general measure for those of working age, covering low income, employment and health issues. The table on the right identifies:

- 84 people in Mount Hawke are receiving some form of DWP benefit, 10.3% of the working age population

Low Income

People living on a low income are among the most deprived groups in society. A person or household living on a low income may be out of work, or in work but on low pay. The table below highlights:

- Based on the Index of Multiple Deprivation, 203 people across Mount Hawke are income deprived (13.6% of all people)
- Children and older people are typically more vulnerable to low income. Across Mount Hawke, 12.7% of all children live in income deprived households (34 children). 19.4% of older people in rural areas receive the Pension Credit Guarantee Element (corresponding to 90 older people)

Health in Mount Hawke

Health

Health is a fundamental determinant of quality of life, having a direct impact on an individual's ability to live a fulfilling and enjoyable life and also indirectly impacting on their ability to sustain standards of living through income.

Ill health may also have a severe effect on other people, either directly through changing relationships (for example forcing people into informal unpaid care), or through indirect effects such as change in household income

- 147 people in Mount Hawke report themselves as having a limiting long-term illness, 13.9% of the population (compared with 13.5% of people across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly)
- DWP health benefit data shows that 80 older people in Mount Hawke receive Attendance Allowance (17.4% of all older people)
- Across Mount Hawke, 67 people receive Disability Living Allowance (4.4% of all people)

Access to services in Mount Hawke

Access to services is a major factor in quality of life for people in rural communities, where lack of transport can be a primary cause of social exclusion³.

People are at risk from social exclusion where necessary services such as hospitals, education, employment and training centres, or food stores, are not easily accessible. This is especially likely to present difficulties for people without cars or who are unable to drive, whose mobility is limited, and in areas where public transportation is poor:

- 166 households have no car or van, 23.3% of all households in Mount Hawke
- Access to education, training and employment: No households are more than 8km from job centres, no households are more than 8km from secondary schools.
- Access to healthcare: No households are more than 8km from a principal GP site

Housing in Mount Hawke

Overcrowded households, and households lacking central heating

Nationally, rural housing is more likely to be in non-decent condition than housing in urban areas. Across England, the percentage of households living in 'non-decent homes'⁴ is 34% in rural areas, compared with 28% in urban areas⁵.

There is no published data on the number of non-decent homes in Mount Hawke. Data on those households lacking central heating and overcrowded households can give an indication of where housing conditions may play a role in exclusion. There are also links with fuel poverty issues –people in households lacking central heating are more likely to experience fuel poverty.

Across Mount Hawke:

- 60 households lack central heating (8.5% of all households). 22 households are overcrowded
- Social housing levels are lower in Mount Hawke than across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly, with 53 households renting from the Local Authority or Registered Social Landlords (7.5% of all households)

Appendix B: Settlements in the South West region

The Office for National Statistics Settlement definitions

The Office for National Statistics Settlement definitions are based on physical extent, rather than by any administrative boundaries. Settlements must be at least 20 hectares in extent with “continuous built-up areas of land containing urban structures”. In other words, the settlements identify cities, towns and villages as defined by their visible boundaries, with boundaries ending where the green fields begin.

The ONS have developed settlement boundaries for all settlements with a population of more than 300 people, with look-up tables for Output Areas (standard statistical geographies).

As little data is available at Output Area level (essentially, only Census 2001 data is available), we have developed lookup tables for Super Output Area to the settlements, and have developed profile reports for those rural settlements with more than 300 people (those settlements with populations greater than 10,000 are defined as “urban”, and are included for completeness).

We have developed profiles for all settlements in the South-West
